CURRENT CLINICAL PRACTICE

Colorectal Surgery

My current clinical practice at the North Middlesex University Hospital NHS Trust is in Colorectal Surgery. My experience over many years is in open colorectal surgery.

Since approximately 2008 I have also been undertaking laparoscopic and laparoscopic-assisted colorectal surgery. I introduced the practice of laparoscopic colorectal surgery at the hospital Trust and was a member of the team which developed the business case and equipped the Operating Theatre Suite with the appropriate equipment.

In approximately 2010 I introduced the Enhanced Recovery after Surgery (ERAS) programme at the hospital Trust.

At the North Middlesex University Hospital NHS we accept referrals from a wide area in north/northeast London and we investigate and treat patients with colorectal cancer. We have weekly MDT meetings attended by the colorectal surgeons, oncologists, gastroenterologists and radiologists. The Oncology service is provided locally by oncologists from UCLH NHS Foundation Trust. The hospital MDT is part of the North Central London Cancer network. I attend the MDT weekly conferences regularly.

The activity of the Colorectal Department, the performance of the MDT, the patient treatment pathways and outcomes are regularly reviewed by the formal external peer review as part of the validation process of the hospital and the department in the provision of cancer services.

I have experience in the diagnosis and management of colorectal polyps and cancer. See below recent publications/abstracts/scientific presentations at national and international meetings.

I undertake the following surgical procedures.

Colorectal surgery open and laparoscopic.

Anterior resection of the rectum and total mesorectal excision.

Colonic J-pouch reconstruction.

Abdominoperineal excision of rectum.

Hemicolectomy, subtotal colectomy.

Panproctocolectomy, restorative proctocolectomy and ileoanal pouch.

Resection rectopexy, rectosigmoidectomy and other procedures for rectal prolapse.

Surgery for fistula-in-ano.

Haemorrhoidectomy, internal sphincterotomy.

Laparoscopic, General and Emergency Surgery

In addition to colorectal surgery, which is my main specialty interest, I have extensive experience in general surgery, emergency surgery and laparoscopic surgery. I have been undertaking laparoscopic cholecystectomy since 1992. I have undertaken general and emergency surgery throughout my years of training and since being appointed consultant. I participate in the on call rota for surgery at the NHS hospital Trust.

Procedures performed regularly include:

Laparoscopic cholecystectomy.

Open cholecystectomy and bile duct exploration.

Hernia repair: inguinal, femoral, umbilical and incisional.

Abdominal hernia repair, abdominal wall reconstruction and component separation technique.

Abdominoplasty and abdominal wall repair.

Emergency surgery for appendicitis, diverticulitis, bowel perforation, bowel ischaemia, bowel obstruction etc.

Cosmetic Surgery

I trained in Cosmetic Surgery techniques as a consultant, by undertaking attachments with independent practising cosmetic surgeons between 1996 and 2000.

I have carried out breast augmentation, abdominoplasty and liposculpture.

TRAINING COURSES AND CONFERENCES

I have attended and continue to attend many conferences and training courses in colorectal surgery, laparoscopic colorectal surgery, enhanced recovery after surgery and other related subjects.

I also regularly attend the annual Bond Solon conferences on updates for expert witnesses.

I undertake annual appraisal at the NHS Hospital Trust.

In July 2019 I successfully revalidated with the GMC. My next GMC revalidation is due in July 2024.
